



Drum Major Camp Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

Q: Who will be responsible for the participants throughout the 3 days?

A: We have hired a dedicated team of camp counselors (all over 22 years old) to ensure the safety of camp participants and address their needs. Pacific Crest administrators and staff will also be on hand.

Q: What do I need to bring?

A: For the three-day camp, you will need to have appropriate attire for three active days of workshops/activities. Make sure your clothes and footwear are comfortable and allow you to be active, as well as comfortable. You should bring sunscreen and a baseball hat. We also recommend you bring a 1/2 gallon water jug and a book bag or small backpack for supplies/materials given to you at the camp. Bring a pen/pencil too!

If attending the residential camp, you should bring items needed for overnight accommodations, including toiletries and towel for showering; a sleeping bag or air mattress with sheets and blankets, and clothes for warm Southern California weather and clothes for cool nights.

Suggested Packing List (Commuter Camp)

Comfortable clothes (t-shirts, shorts, etc.)
Good quality athletic shoes
Baseball hat, lip balm, sunscreen, sunglasses
Water jug (half-gallon) or reusable water bottle
Jacket/sweatshirt, Long pants/sweats for cold weather
Small backpack for any supplies/personal items needed if desired

Suggested Packing List (Residential Camp)

Camp Activities

Comfortable clothes (t-shirts, shorts, etc.)
Good quality athletic shoes
Baseball hat, lip balm, sunscreen, sunglasses
Water jug (half-gallon) or water bottle
Jacket and sweatshirt
Long pants, shorts, and sweats for cold weather
Underwear and socks
Small backpack for supplies and pen/pencil

Showering

Deodorant or antiperspirant
Shampoo, soap
Hairbrush/comb, toothbrush and toothpaste
Shower shoes
Towel

Sleeping

Clothes to sleep in
Pillow and sleeping bag or air mattress

Q: Will there be a First-Aid Kit available?

A: Yes. A first-aid kit is always available at Pacific Crest's mobile kitchen. We also will have health team members on site.

Q: For the residential camp, how will sleeping over at the high school work?

A: Participants will have a separate indoor section of the school to sleep in. Boys and girls will be separated for privacy. Wake-up and lights-out will be enforced by Pacific Crest.

Q: Will there be a place to store personal items (cell phone, wallet, keys, etc.)?

A: While we will mainly be in one area of the campus, the camp will require moving around to other places. It is advised you leave valuables/personal items at home. If you do decide to bring anything with you, be sure to keep it with you at all times. Pacific Crest is not responsible for loss/damage of personal property.

Q: How will sleeping over at the high school work?

A: All of the participants will have a separate section of the school to sleep in. Boys and girls will be separated for privacy. Wake up and lights out will be enforced by Pacific Crest

Q: Do I need to bring money?

A: Everything is covered under your registration fee, so there is no need to bring additional money with you to the camp.
